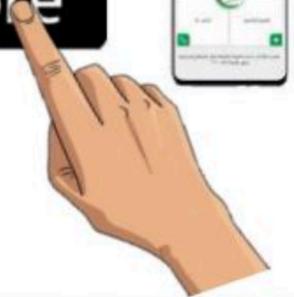





In history, some decisions looked small but later proved very important. In 1876, Western Union controlled the telegraph. Its president, William Orton, refused to buy Alexander

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Graham Bell's telephone patent for \$100,000, calling it a "novelty." Bell kept the patent and built his own company, which became the largest in the U.S. In 1912, the Titanic ignored six iceberg warnings. The captain increased speed, and the radio operator failed to deliver the last warning. The ship hit an iceberg, and more than 1,500 people died. In 1867, Russia sold Alaska to the U.S. for \$7.2 million. People laughed at the purchase, calling it "Seward's Folly." Later, gold was discovered, and Alaska became very valuable. In the 1980s, Coca-Cola changed its recipe to New Coke. Although taste tests were positive, customers were outraged. New Coke was a flop, and the company had to bring back the original formula.
